



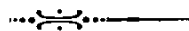

TWENTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ASSOCIATION FOR CROATIAN STUDIES 1977-1997

"The ACS is a nonprofit, nonpolitical, and professional organization whose purpose is to advance scholarly study, publication, and teaching relating to Croatia and the Croats. The ACS will foster closer communication among scholars interested in Croatian Studies." (Article 2 of the Constitution and By-Laws of the ACS)

A BRIEF CHRONOLOGY OF THE ACS

The idea of forming an organization devoted to Croatian studies within AAASS is seriously discussed during the AAASS Convention in Atlanta.

October 15 - A group of ten Croatian participants at the AAASS Convention at Capital Hilton hotel in Washington D.C. agrees to establish a "Society for Croatian Studies." Prof. Joseph T. Bombelles is elected as acting President and Prof. George J. Prpić as Secretary-Treasurer. The two were entrusted to undertake all necessary provisions in order to affiliate the organization with the AAASS. Other members of the provisional Executive Committee are Prof. Ante Kadić and Prof. Francis H. Eterović, Vice Presidents.

November 27 - At a meeting during the Twelfth Annual Seminar of the American Croatian Academic Society at Case-Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio the proposed name "Society for Croatian Studies" was changed into "Association for Croatian Studies."

January - Proposed Constitution and By-Laws of The Association for Croatian Studies is submitted to the membership. Application with all the necessary documentation is sent to the AAASS for affiliation purposes.

First issue of *ANNOUNCEMENT*, the ACS' circular, was published by dr. George Prpić.

July - The AAASS' Executive Secretary informs the ACS secretary that the ACS' application and all other documents submitted to them are lost. The delaying practices of the AAASS are

protested. Finally, the answer comes that the ACS will be accepted by the AAASS in October 1978 and a panel session at the annual National Convention in October 1978 is allotted to it.

October 12 - The first "public appearance" of the ACS. A panel session under the title "Croatia and the Croats in the 1970s" is held as a part of the AAASS National Convention at Columbus Ohio.

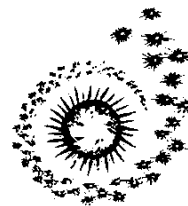
October 13 - Provisional Executive Committee of the ACS becomes a permanent one and the Constitution and By-Laws are accepted under the condition that they will be revised. Their revision depends on the affiliation with the AAASS, which is the most important concern at the time.

October 15 - The Board of Directors of the AAASS accepts the ACS as an affiliated member organization.

1983 **June 8** - The ACS was incorporated in the State of Ohio.

1984 **November 14** - The ACS became "exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code." All membership dues, donations, gifts, and bequests to the ACS may be deducted from the Federal Income Tax.

December - Starting with issue No. 10, the name of the ACS' official publication is changed from *ANNOUNCEMENT* to the *BULLETIN* of the ACS.

VI ICCEES WORLD CONGRESS IN TAMPERE, FINLAND, JULY 29-AUGUST 3, 2000

The ICCEES has selected Tampere, Finland, as the site for its VI World Congress, which will take place July 29-August 3, 2000. Tampere is located 175 km north of Helsinki with frequent flight, train and bus connections to and from Helsinki.

Local host and organizers will be the Finnish Association for Russian and East European Studies (FAREES), the Finish Institute for Russian and East European Studies (FIREES) and the University of Tampere. The Congress will be organized at the premises of Tampere Hall and the University of Tampere, located next to each other. In addition to the academic program there will be a varied social program and excursions.

Call for proposals

The International Program Committee (IPC) invites proposals for panels and roundtables. The proposals

should present the results of new research on Central and Eastern Europe and the former Soviet Union.

Although traditional themes are certainly not to be neglected, the IPC encourages the proposals for multidisciplinary themes and special fields of study.

The IPC particularly encourages young scholars and those who have not presented papers at previous Congresses to submit proposals.

Guidelines for proposals

Participants are requested to take account of the following guidelines in drawing up their proposals.

1. Panels and roundtables should be international in composition. All sessions and papers should be strictly scholarly in nature. All sessions to be printed in the official program must be approved by the IPC.

2. No person should be proposed without his or her consent.

3. Panels should normally include: chair, no more than 3 presenters of papers and one discussant. Presenters and discussants will normally be limited to no more than 15 minutes in their oral presentation.

4. A limited number of roundtables will be included. Their format will be decided by their organizers, subjects to approval by the IPC.

5. Papers not accepted for formal presentations in a panel session may be included in the official program as individual papers, subject to approval of the IPC. At the discretion of the Committee, individual papers may be attached to relevant panels. In such case, panel chairs will be asked to allow authors of individual papers to speak from the floor for no more than 5 minutes. Individual papers can be eligible for inclusion in the selected papers of the Congress. A poster session will be organized for authors of individual papers so that they may discuss their work with interested scholars.

6. It will be a condition of participation that a one-page abstract in English is received six months in advance. Instructions for the submission of abstracts will be given in the letter of invitation in the summer of 1999. Presenters will be expected to bring copies of the full text of their paper to the Congress. All papers listed in the official program can be eligible for publication in the Congress Proceedings.

7. The working languages of the Congress will be English, French, German and Russian. The administrative language will be English. No official interpretation will be provided. Participants who need such assistance will be required to make their own arrangements.

Please note that all participants are expected to pay the registration fee and to meet their own travel and subsistence costs.

Procedure for making proposals

Proposers of panels, roundtables and individual papers are asked to use the form provided.

The following information will be needed:

1. Full names and affiliations of all participants. Full addresses, telephone and fax numbers and e-mail addresses if available.

2. Titles of panels and roundtables, and paper titles.
3. Brief description of the panel or roundtable, and keywords.

4. Brief curriculum vitae (up to one page for each participant), providing outline details of post and positions held and main publications.

5. All proposals must be sent to the Congress Secretariat in 3 copies or electronically as advised at <http://www.rusin.fi/iccees>

Timetable for making proposals

All proposals should reach the Congress Secretariat by January 1, 1999. The preliminary program will then be drawn up and official letters of invitation with registration forms and instructions for the submission of abstracts sent to all participants.

Book Review - Our member, dr. Nicholas I. Novosel's review of *Beyond Yugoslavia: Politics, Economics, and Culture in a Shattered Community*. Ed. Sabrina P. Ramet and Ljubiša S. Adamovich. Boulder, CO: Westview Press, 1995 was published in *Slavic Review* Vol. 56, No. 1, Spring 1997, pp. 132-133. Dr. Novosel concludes: "In her excellent conclusion to the book, Ramet contends that, on the whole, there are only general areas of agreement among the authors: the relationship between nationalism and democracy is problematical; the conflicts do not stem from 'ancient hatreds'; and 1986-91 were the crucial years in which decisions were made that pushed the country over the brink. Having said this, Ramet continues with an analysis of American and western policy. The basic conclusion is that no one wanted to become seriously involved, much like the previous example of the Spanish Civil War. Another keen observation is that in all diplomatic discussions, negotiators never asked themselves whether their options or formulas were conducive to stability."

Diversity has been the core of Bosnia and Herzegovina's personality. Even its "dualistic" name and physical geography display a lack of homogeneity. The medieval Bosnian state never enjoyed lasting political and ideological unity. Its rifts were feudal, regional, and religious in nature, or a combination of the three. Because of its location and by a quirk of history, three major world religious and cultural traditions (Catholicism, Islam and Orthodoxy) became cohabitants in this small Balkan country. The recent birth of its statehood, however, has been exceptionally bloody and its diversity has been shaken. At the present time, it is hard to say if this new European country is in the process of remaking or of breaking itself.

The *Historical Dictionary of Bosnia and Herzegovina* was created to assist the interested researcher in sifting through the long and complicated history of this region -- from its first settlement by Paleolithic and Neolithic tribes, through the Roman, Medieval and Ottoman periods, to monarchical rule by the Austrians and Hungarians, incorporation into Yugoslavia, and through the war of aggression cum civil ethnic conflict to the implementation of the Dayton accord to the present day.
